
Undergraduate studies

Undergraduate programs are the first of three levels of university studies. Various types of undergraduate programs offer numerous possibilities, allowing you to tailor your education to your interests. These types of programs differ mainly in their duration and number of credits.

To obtain a diploma, you must complete the credits associated with a program.



Each level of study is divided into several sessions, each spanning 15 weeks, during which you complete courses and earn credits.



The most common undergraduate program is the bachelor's degree,

though various combinations of shorter programs can also lead to it.



Short undergraduate programs

Consisting of 15 credits and usually completed in one session, these complementary programs provide with you an introduction to a discipline. Short undergraduate programs cannot be combined to obtain a bachelor's degree.

Important!

Take note of this major difference: At UdeM, a major is a short program consisting of 60 credits, whereas at anglophone universities, a major refers to the main concentration or specialization within a program.






Professional and research programs

What are the French requirements?

To study at UdeM, you must demonstrate that your spoken and written French skills meet the program's requirements. Refer to the program description for the accepted proof of French language proficiency. If you lack the necessary proof, you'll need to take a test, ensuring you meet the required thresholds and deadlines.



If you don't have Canadian citizenship or permanent residence, you must obtain the necessary authorizations to study at UdeM before your arrival in Canada:

Study permit issued by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)



Entry visa issued by IRCC or an electronic travel authorization (eTA) depending on your situation

UdeM glossary: Your quick guide to key terms

Access code

Your access code is a unique identifier provided by UdeM that allows you to securely access IT platforms and tools. It can be formed from the letter p followed by seven digits or from two letters followed by 5 digits.

Admission

Step which consists of submitting an application to a study program.

Registration

Step which consists of registering for the courses that will constitute your schedule for the intended session.

Session

Also known as a semester. Spanning the 12 months of the year, the academic year is divided into three sessions of approximately 15 weeks each:

all

→ September 1 to December 31

Winter

→ January 1 to April 30

Summer (optional for undergraduates)

→ May 1 to August 15

Note that official course start dates may vary.

Student Centre

Also known as your Centre étudiant. This online platform allows you to track your admission application after submitting it.

Studying full-time

At the undergraduate level, you study full-time if your course registration totals 12 credits or more for a session. At the graduate level, course registration must total 9 credits or more in the fall or winter and 6 credits in the summer.

Studying part-time

At the undergraduate level, you study part-time if your course registration totals 12 credits or more for a session. At the graduate level, course registration must total less than 9 credits in the fall or winter and less than 6 credits in the summer.

UNIP

Combined with your access code, this password allows you to securely access IT platforms and tools.

Visitor account

If you don't have a UdeM account, this temporary account allows you to submit an application to a study program and access the Centre étudiant.
